Meeting called to order at 6:45pm by Jack O'Guinn

Elections:

Elections for the President and Treasurer positions. These positions are for a two-year term.

Currently Jack O'Guinn is president and was running again unopposed.

Currently Tim Engleman is treasurer and was running again unopposed.

C.K. Nation made a motion for both men to be voted in for their respective positions and Janice Corcoran seconded it.

Vote held for HPNA members there and both were unanimously voted in for another two-year team. Motion passed.

HPNA Board:

HPNA Membership dues:

This tabled topic was brought back for discussion.

The regular yearly membership was \$20 senior, \$40 for residents and \$50 for businesses. To increase cash flow for the HPNA it was brought up to have monthly dues of \$10. Brad Nation motioned to increase the membership dues to \$10/month. It was seconded by Tim Engleman. Member vote majority was yes. One member voted no. Motion passed.

Open Discussion:

- Jack will continue to be prepared for the Bernalillo County application for \$2500 to neighborhood associations for the 4th quarter 2019.
- Question arose asking as we part of the black hills squatters? Jack response, no and that Sgt Simmons has a new tactic for neighborhoods and Jack will get more info on this.
- Flooding in neighborhood recently. Jack wants to draft a letter to the city planning maybe to help redirect flow of water.
- Crosswalk at Mt Everest and Tivoli is very faded. Can we get city to repaint? Jack will investigate this.
- Crosswalk or something needed at Golden Gate and Juan Tabo for kids crossing to and from school at John Baker Elementary or Hoover Middle School.
- Lighting in neighborhood is poor. Jack said when lights go out the City and PNM are replacing with brighter LED bulbs. Even a very dim light can be replaced. Jack will check who we notify for light bulb replacements.
- Jack asked if there was in interest in selling high end candles to raise money for HPNA. There was no interest.
